  - (i) if dated, refers to that particular version; and
  - (ii) if not dated, refers to the latest version and therefore may be subject to change over time;
- (e) unless specified otherwise, any reference to a section of an Act refers to that section of the EP Act; and
- (f) unless specified otherwise, all definitions are in accordance with the EP Act.

**NOTE:** This licence requires specific conditions to be met but does not provide any implied authorisation for other emissions, discharges, or activities not specified in this licence.

## Licence conditions

The licence holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

### Infrastructure and equipment

1. The licence holder must ensure the site infrastructure and equipment listed in Table 1 and located at the corresponding infrastructure location is maintained and operated in accordance with the corresponding operational requirement set out in that table.

## Monitoring

### General monitoring

2. The licence holder must maintain a log of the operating parameters listed in Table 2, expressed in the corresponding units listed in that table.

### Records and reporting

3. All information and records required by the licence must:
  - (a) be legible;
  - (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original and subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
  - (c) except for records listed in condition 3(d), be retained for at least 6 years from the date the records were made or until the expiry of the licence or any subsequent licence; and
  - (d) for those following records, be retained until the expiry of the licence and any subsequent licence:
    - (i) off-site environmental effects; or
    - (ii) matters which affect the condition of the land or waters.
4. The licence holder must submit a report every six months to the CEO detailing operating parameters of the premises from 29 November 2014. The report is to include hourly averages of the data required by condition 2 and must be submitted no later than one calendar month after the six month monitoring period.
5. The licence holder must:
  - (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the conditions of this licence during the preceding annual period; and
  - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO, by no later than 28 December in each year, an Annual Audit Compliance Report in the approved form.

## Definitions
