Interpretation

In this licence:

- (a) the words ‘including’, ‘includes’ and ‘include’ in conditions mean “including but not limited to”, and similar, as appropriate;
- (b) where any word or phrase is given a defined meaning, any other part of speech or other grammatical form of that word or phrase has a corresponding meaning;
- (c) where tables are used in a condition, each row in a table constitutes a separate condition;
- (d) any reference to an Australian or other standard, guideline, or code of practice in this licence:
 - (i) if dated, refers to that particular version; and
 - (ii) if not dated, refers to the latest version and therefore may be subject to change over time;
- (e) unless specified otherwise, any reference to a section of an Act refers to that section of the EP Act; and
- (f) unless specified otherwise, all definitions are in accordance with the EP Act.

NOTE: This licence requires specific conditions to be met but does not provide any implied authorisation for other emissions, discharges, or activities not specified in this licence.

Licence conditions

The licence holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

Infrastructure and equipment

1. The licence holder must ensure that the site infrastructure and equipment listed in Table 1 is maintained and operated in accordance with the corresponding operational requirement set out in Table 1.

Table 1: Infrastructure and equipment requirements

Site infrastructure and equipment	Operational requirement
Product storage silo	Storage of fly ash
Airslide silo filling system	Maintain a negative pressure to minimise dust emissions
Fabric filter	Fitted with electronic sensors to cease transfer of the flyash in the event of a filter failure

Site infrastructure and equipment	Operational requirement
Truck loading chute system	Fitted with a level sensor to ensure flyash transfer into the truck is optimised

Operations

- The licence holder must only accept onto the premises waste of a waste type, which does not exceed the corresponding rate at which waste is received, and which meets the corresponding acceptance specification set out in Table 2.

- The licence holder must ensure that wastes accepted onto the premises are only subjected to the process set out in Table 3.

Emissions and discharges

- The licence holder must:
 - implement all practical measures to prevent stormwater run-off becoming contaminated by the activities on the premises; and
 - treat contaminated or potentially contaminated stormwater as necessary prior to being discharged from the premises.

Fugitive emissions

- The licence holder must use all reasonable and practical measures to prevent and where that is not practicable to minimise dust emissions from the premises.
- The licence holder must ensure that no visible dust generated by the activities on the premises crosses the boundary of the premises.

Monitoring

Inputs and outputs

- The licence holder must undertake monitoring in Table 4 according to the specifications in that table.

Records and reporting

Records

- 8.** All information and records required by the licence holder must:
 - (a) be legible;
 - (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original and subsequent amendments remain legible or are capable of retrieval;
 - (c) except for records listed in 8(d) be retained for at least 6 years from the date the records were made or until the expiry of the Licence or any subsequent licence; and
 - (d) for those following records, be retained until the expiry of the Licence and any subsequent licence:
 - (i) off-site environmental effects; or
 - (ii) matters which affect condition of the land or waters.

- 9.** The licence holder must ensure that:
 - (a) any person left in charge of the premises is aware of the conditions of this licence and has access at all times to this licence or copies thereof; and
 - (b) any person who performs tasks on the premises is informed of all of the conditions of this Licence that relate to the tasks which that person is performing.

- 10.** The licence holder must:
 - (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the conditions of this licence during the preceding annual period; and
 - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO by no later than 28 July each year an Annual Audit Compliance Report in the approved form.

- 11.** The licence holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the licence holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
 - (a) the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided);
 - (b) the time and date of the complaint;
 - (c) the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
 - (d) the complete details and dates of any action taken by the licence holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.

- 12.** The licence holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this licence:
 - (a) the calculation of fees payable in respect of this licence;
 - (b) any maintenance of infrastructure that is performed in the course of complying with condition 1 of this licence;
 - (c) monitoring programmes undertaken in accordance with condition 6 of this licence;
 - (d) summary of any failure or malfunction of any pollution control equipment and any environmental incidents that have occurred during the annual period and any action taken; and
 - (e) complaints received under condition 11 of this licence.

- 13.** The books specified under condition 12 must:
- (a) be legible;
 - (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
 - (c) be retained by the licence holder for the duration of the licence; and
 - (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.

The red line depicts the Premises boundary in the map below.

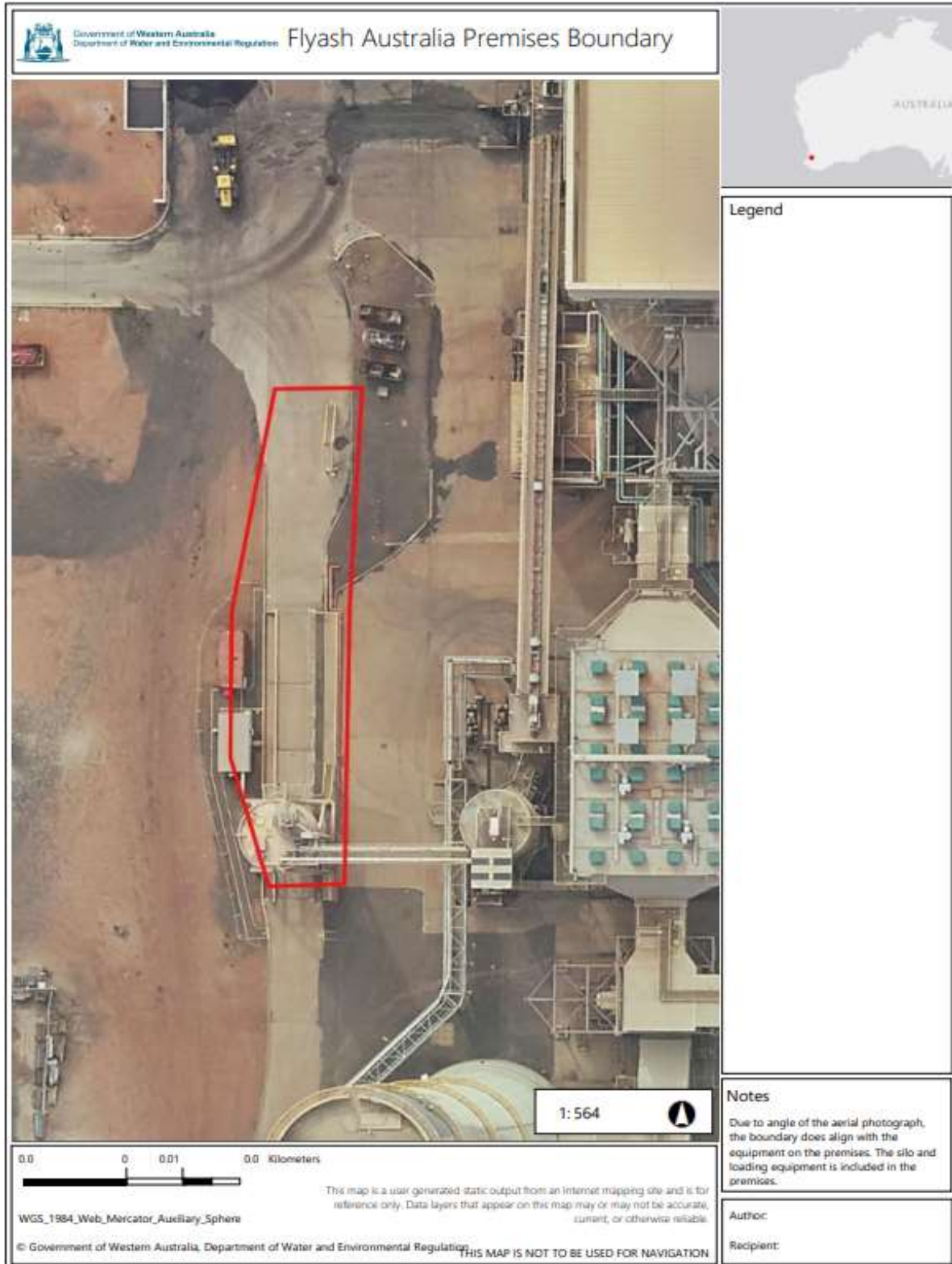


Figure 1: Map of the prescribed premises boundary

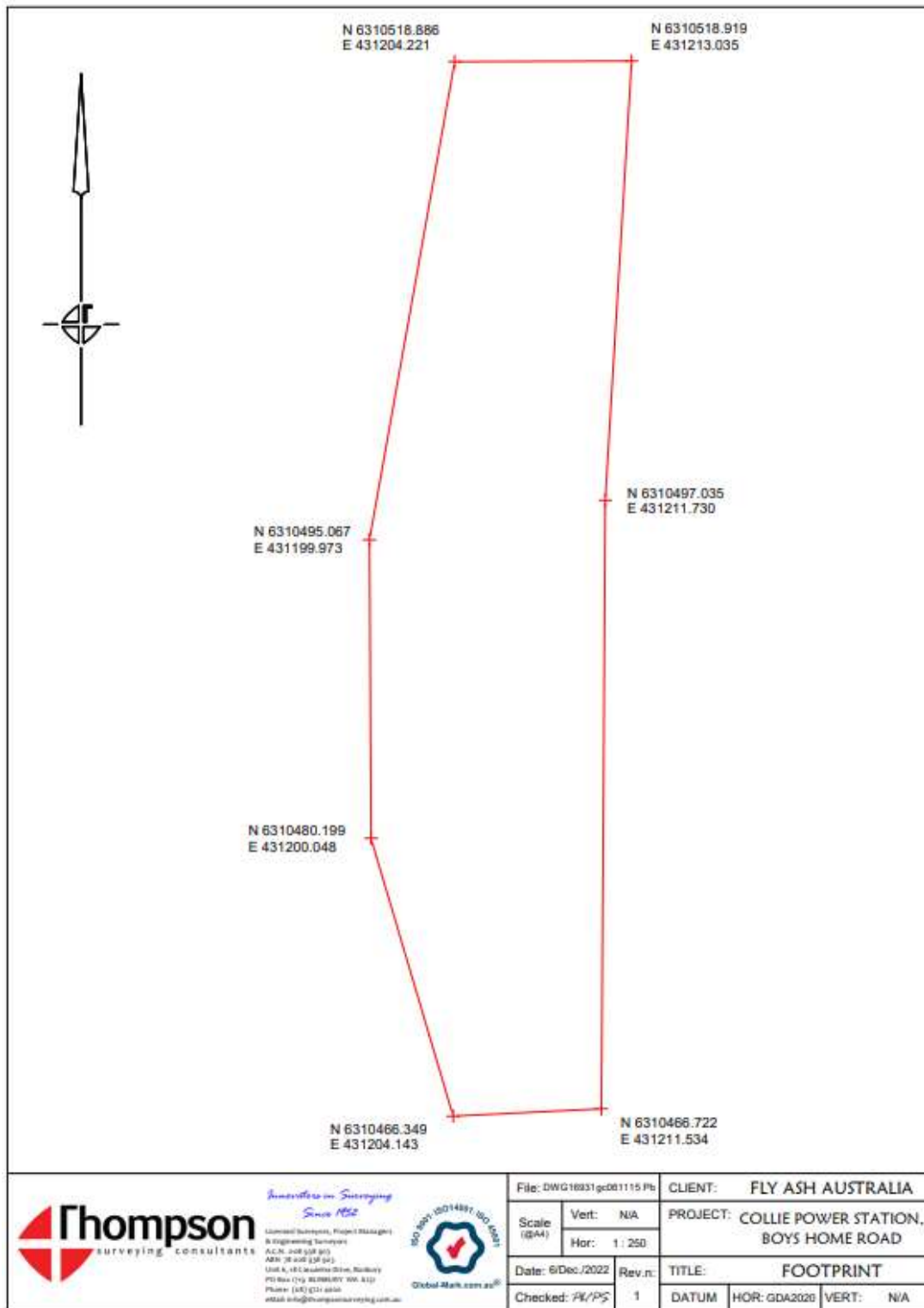


Figure 2: Map of boundary coordinates (supplied by licence holder)
