Interpretation

In this licence:

- (c) where tables are used in a condition, each row in a table constitutes a separate condition;
- (d) any reference to an Australian or other standard, guideline, or code of practice in this licence:
 - (i) if dated, refers to that particular version; and
 - (ii) if not dated, refers to the latest version and therefore may be subject to change over time;
- (e) unless specified otherwise, any reference to a section of an Act refers to that section of the EP Act; and
- (f) unless specified otherwise, all definitions are in accordance with the EP Act.

NOTE: This licence requires specific conditions to be met but does not provide any implied authorisation for other emissions, discharges, or activities not specified in this licence.

Licence conditions

The licence holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

Premises Operation

1. The Licence Holder shall only accept waste onto the Premises if:
 - (a) it is of a type listed in Table 1;
 - (b) the quantity accepted is at or below any quantity limit listed in Table 1; and
 - (c) it meets any specification listed in Table 1:

Inert Waste Type 1	50,000 tonnes per annum	Recycled, recovered asphalt material that is free from rock, glass and asbestos, sourced from residential, construction and demolition, commercial and industrial waste only.

2. The Licence Holder must ensure that the waste types specified in Table 2 are only subjected to the corresponding process, subject to the corresponding process limits and/or specifications.

Infrastructure and equipment

3. The Licence Holder shall ensure that the infrastructure and equipment specified in Column 1 of Table 3 is maintained in good working order and operated in accordance with the requirements specified in Column 2 of Table 3.

Records and reporting

5. The Licence Holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this licence:
- the calculation of fees payable in respect of this licence;
 - any maintenance of infrastructure that is performed in the course of complying with conditions 1 to 3 of this licence;
 - monitoring programs undertaken in accordance with condition 4 of this licence; and
 - complaints received under condition 7 of this licence.
6. The books specified under condition 5 must:
- be legible;
 - if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
 - be retained by the licence holder for the duration of the licence; and

- (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.
7. The Licence Holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the licence holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
- (a) the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided);
 - (b) the time and date of the complaint;
 - (c) the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
 - (d) the complete details and dates of any action taken by the licence holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.
8. The Licence Holder must:
- (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the conditions of this licence during the preceding annual period; and
 - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO by no later than 31 December annually after the end of that annual period an Annual Audit Compliance Report in the approved form.
9. The Licence Holder must comply with a Department Request, within 14 days from the date of the Department Request or such other period as agreed to by the Inspector or the CEO.

Figure 1: Map of the boundary of the prescribed premises




Figure 2: Premises layout
