## Interpretation

In this licence:

- (c) where tables are used in a condition, each row in a table constitutes a separate condition;

  - (i) if dated, refers to that particular version; and
  - (ii) if not dated, refers to the latest version and therefore may be subject to change over time;
- (e) unless specified otherwise, any reference to a section of an Act refers to that section of the EP Act; and
- (f) unless specified otherwise, all definitions are in accordance with the EP Act.

**NOTE:** This licence requires specific conditions to be met but does not provide any implied authorisation for other emissions, discharges, or activities not specified in this licence.

## Licence conditions

The licence holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

### Infrastructure and operations

1. The licence holder must ensure that the site infrastructure and equipment listed in Table 1 and located at the corresponding infrastructure location is maintained and operated in accordance with the corresponding operational requirement set out in Table 1.

Water cart	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Must be available at all times at the premises during operation phase to suppress dust.</li> </ul>	
Light vehicles and haulage trucks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Warning light reversing alarms to be fitted to minimise noise (as opposed to audible alarms or beepers).</li> </ul>	

2. The licence holder must ensure that operations at the premises only occur between the hours of 07:00 to 17:00 on the days Monday through to Friday, and from 08:00 to 17:00 on Saturdays and at no time on Sundays or public holidays.
3. The licence holder must ensure that no visible dust generated from the operations crosses the boundary of the premises.
4. The licence holder shall ensure clean stormwater is diverted around operational areas and potentially contaminated stormwater is retained onsite using contour bunds and stormwater detention basins.

5. The licence holder shall store environmentally hazardous materials in secured, covered, impervious and bunded areas.
6. The licence holder shall immediately recover, or remove and dispose of, spills of environmentally hazardous materials including fuel, oil, or other hydrocarbons, whether inside or outside an engineered containment system.

## Records and reporting

7. The licence holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the licence holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
  - (a) the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided);
  - (b) the time and date of the complaint;
  - (c) the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
  - (d) the complete details and dates of any action taken by the licence holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.
8. The licence holder must:
  - (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the conditions of this licence during the preceding annual period; and
  - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO by no later than 30 days after the end of that annual period an Annual Audit Compliance Report in the approved form.
9. The licence holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this licence:
  - (a) the calculation of fees payable in respect of this licence;
  - (b) any maintenance of infrastructure that is performed in the course of complying with condition 1 of this licence; and
  - (c) complaints received under condition 7 of this licence.
10. The books specified under condition 9 must:
  - (a) be legible;
  - (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
  - (c) be retained by the licence holder for the duration of the licence; and
  - (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.

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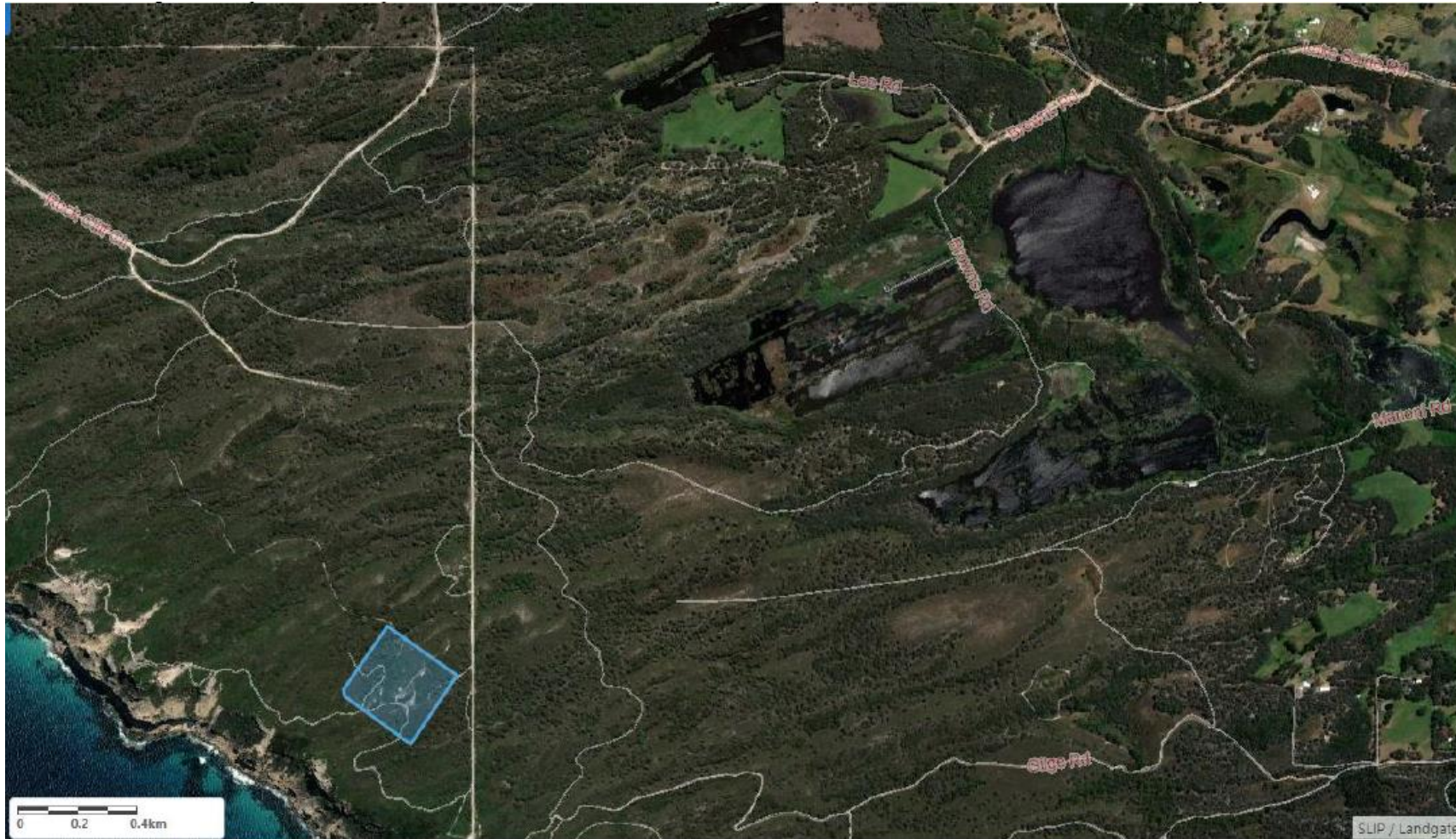
