Licence conditions

The Licence Holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

Infrastructure and equipment

- 1. The Licence Holder must ensure that the site infrastructure and equipment listed in Schedule 3, Table 5 and located at the corresponding infrastructure location is maintained and operated in good working order.
- 2. The Licence Holder must ensure that the site infrastructure and equipment listed in Table 1 is adequately maintained in good working order to ensure it can be operated in accordance with the requirements set out in Table 1.

3. The Licence Holder must ensure that the emissions specified in Table 2, are discharged only from the corresponding discharge point and only at the corresponding discharge point location.

4. The Licence Holder must ensure that no visible dust generated from the Primary Activities crosses the boundary of the Premises.

Records and reporting

- 5. The Licence Holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the licence holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
 - (a) the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided);
 - (b) the time and date of the complaint;
 - (c) the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
 - (d) the complete details and dates of any action taken by the licence holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.
- **6.** The Licence Holder must:
 - (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the conditions of this licence during the preceding annual period; and
 - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO by no later than 30 April an Annual Audit Compliance Report in the approved form.
- 7. The Licence Holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this licence:
 - (a) the calculation of fees payable in respect of this licence;
 - (b) the maintenance of infrastructure required to ensure that it is kept in good working order in accordance with condition 2 of this licence;
 - (c) logbook recordings of water truck deployment;
 - (d) logbook recordings of oily water separator clean-out and disposal; and
 - (e) complaints received under condition 5 of this licence.
- **8.** The books specified under condition 7 must:
 - (a) be legible;
 - (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
 - (c) be retained by the licence holder for the duration of the licence; and
 - (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.
