1. **Decision summary**

Under the regulatory framework the Delegated Officer decided to process the application to renew licence L7040/1997/9 without conducting any additional risk assessment.

In renewing the licence the Delegated Officer has determined to:

- update the format and appearance of the licence;
- add a new condition with waste acceptance specifications;
- remove redundant conditions;
- include conditions considered necessary for the effective administration of the licence (i.e. record keeping and reporting requirements);
- revise licence conditions and consolidate existing pollution control conditions;
- correct clerical mistakes and unintentional errors; and
- transfer all existing regulatory controls and conditions to the new licence.

As a result of the above, the Delegated Officer decided to grant Licence L7040/1997/9, subject to conditions set out in the attached licence. The Delegated Officer determined to renew the licence for a period of 20 years, in accordance with considerations outlined in the *Guidance Statement: Licence Duration 2016*.

2. Scope of assessment

2.1 Application summary

On 7 June 2022, Gary Ross Higgs and Karen Lee Ann Higgs (licence holder) applied to renew licence L7040/1997/8, as the licence is due to expire on 28 September 2022. The licence was granted to the licence holder for the premises located at Lot 8 on Diagram 29588, Rowley Road, Forrestdale (Premises).

The licence relates to prescribed premises categories as described in Table 1.

3. Regulatory framework

The Delegated Officer has not conducted a full review or a risk assessment of emissions and discharges from the Premises, but solely made administrative type amendments in line with the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation's (department) *Work Instruction: Regulatory Services, COVID-19 licensing position.*

In granting the licence, the Delegated Officer has considered and given due regard to the department's regulatory framework and relevant policy documents which are available at <u>https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents</u>.

4. Considerations for issuing a new licence

4.1 Compliance and enforcement actions

There have been three incidents or complaints identified at the Premises by the department in the last five years which related to odour, dust and the alleged use of wastes other than manure at the Premises.

4.2 Legal occupancy

The licence holder has demonstrated legal occupancy of the Premises.

4.3 Categories of the licence

The requested categories and the corresponding maximum production capacities for the renewal of the licence are consistent with the categories for which the licence holder currently holds a licence and which was previously assessed.

4.4 Planning approval

The City of Armadale has informed the department that it has planning approval for the activities on the Premises and no further planning approvals are required at this time (as outlined in Table 3: Consultation).

5. Summary of changes to the licence conditions

Section 62 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act) provides the legal power to attach conditions to licences. Most licences are issued with conditions as per *Guidance Statement – Setting Conditions* (October 2015) to prevent, control, abate or mitigate pollution or environmental harm as a result of the emissions and/or discharges from the premises in question.

Table 2 summarises the changes from the expiring licence into the new licence including changes made to licence conditions where required and the rationale for changes made.

Local Government Authority advised of application on 7 July 2022.	 The City of Armadale replied on 18 July 2022 confirming the following and in summary: 1. Development approval was issued on 21 April 1993 and no further planning approvals are required; 2. In the past six years no planning compliance matters have been raised; 3. In the past six years the City's Health services has received and responded to two complaints; 4. The City has requested management plans for dust, odour and noise to be included in the renewed licence; and 5. The City has indicated that the premises is located within a sewage sensitive area. 	The Delegated Officer has noted the comments from the City of Armadale. With regards to point 4, the inclusion of management plans would require a risk assessment and cannot be considered at present for the reasons outlined under <i>Regulatory</i> <i>framework</i> above. However, the existing condition relating to odour has been transferred to the renewed licence. With regards to potential dust and noise issues these are regulated under the general provisions of the <i>Environmental Protection Act 1986</i> . With regards to point 5, the existing conditions relating to leachate control have been transferred to the renewed licence. Other aspects of the comments will be taken into consideration when the licence is up for review, as the suggested changes are outside the scope of this administrative renewal process.
