1. Application summary

On 13 January 2022 Brajkovich Demolition Pty Ltd (Licence Holder) applied to renew licence L8736/2013/1, as the existing licence is due to expire on 4 May 2022. The Premises are located within part of Lot 19, 1686 Great Northern Highway in Upper Swan. The licence relates to the prescribed premises category described in Table 1.

The Licence Holder has been operating a salvage yard for over 20 years within part of Lot 19, 1686 Great Northern Highway in Upper Swan. Construction and demolition materials are brought to the site and salvageable material is sorted and stored. The materials are then on sold to customers. Any unsalvageable material is stored on site in a designated area before it is disposed of to an appropriate facility.

Salvageable material is sorted and stored in comparable segregated areas as per the layout shown in Figure 2, Schedule 1 of the licence. Customers purchase materials from the site as required. Each year the site accepts around 1 million bricks, 1 million tiles, 50,000 tonnes of concrete slabs, 1000 tonnes of precast products, 500 tonnes of glass as windows and 100 tonnes of plaster board. The site also accepts various amounts of timber, plastic and metal materials up to 10,000 tonnes. The nominated through-put for the site is 150,000 tonnes per year.

2. Regulatory framework

The Delegated Officer has determined to undertake an administrative renewal of the licence and has not conducted a full review and risk assessment of emissions and discharges from the Premises in line with the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation's (department) *Work Instruction: Regulatory Services, COVID-19 licensing position, October 2021.*

In replacing the licence, the Delegated Officer has considered and given due regard to the department's regulatory framework and relevant policy documents which are available at https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents.

3. Complaints and incident history

There are no records of any incidents or complaints identified at the Premises in the last seven years in the department's Incidents and Complaints Management System (ICMS).

4. Decision summary

Under the regulatory framework the Delegated Officer has determined to grant the licence L8736/2013/2 without conducting any additional assessment or risk assessment.

The existing prescribed premises category and waste types authorised for acceptance have not been reviewed as part of this renewal. The licence will be issued for 20 years.

In renewing the licence, the Delegated Officer has determined to:

- update the format and appearance of the licence;
- remove redundant definitions and conditions and update definitions as required;
- include conditions considered necessary for the effective administration of the licence (i.e. record keeping and reporting requirements); and
- transfer all relevant existing regulatory controls and conditions to the renewed licence.

As a result of this decision, Licence L8736/2013/2 has been granted subject to conditions set out in the attached licence and summarised below.

4.1 Summary of changes to the licence conditions

Section 62 of the EP Act provides general power to impose conditions on licences. All licences are issued with conditions as per *Guidance Statement* – *Setting Conditions* (October 2015) for the purposes of the EP Act to prevent, control, abate or mitigate pollution or environmental harm.

Table 2 summarises the transfer of all appropriate conditions from the expiring licence into the new licence.

4.2 Additional conditions

The renewed licence has been updated to include standard conditions for recording complaints (condition 12) and keeping books (conditions 14 and 15) in line with DWER's *Guidance Statement – Setting Conditions* 2015. These are standardised conditions to allow for the effective administration of the renewed licence.

5. Consultation

The licence renewal application was referred to the City of Swan for comments on 25 February 2022. No comments were received.

The draft licence and this decision report were provided to the licence holder on 17 March 2022 for comment. The licence holder provided a response on 28 March 2022 providing requested premises boundary coordinates and waived the remainder of the consult period.

6. Conclusion

Based on the assessment in this Decision Report the Delegated Officer has determined to grant Licence L8736/2013/2. The licence is subject to conditions commensurate with the determined controls as well as conditions necessary for administration and annual reporting requirements.
