## Amendment Notice

This amendment is made pursuant to section 59 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act) to amend the Licence issued under the EP Act for a prescribed premises as set out below. This notice of amendment is given under section 59B(9) of the EP Act.

## Amendment description

Licence L8419/2010/3 was granted to Western Australian Specialty Alloys Pty Ltd in February 2016 for the operation of a metal melting and finishing factory in Canning Vale. This amendment relates to an extension of the Licence expiry date from 4 February 2018 to 4 February 2036.

## Amendment history

## Decision

Section 63 of the EP Act prescribes that a licence shall continue in force for such period as is specified in the licence. Licence L8419/2010/3 is due to expire on 4 February 2018.

In determining to amend the duration of the Licence, the following matters were considered by the Delegated Officer:

- The risks posed by emissions from the premises have not changed since the previous Licence was granted; and
- The Licence Holder can apply to amend the Conditions of this Licence under s 59 of the EP Act. An application form for this purpose is available from DWER. Or, the CEO may also amend the Conditions of the Licence at any time on the initiative of the CEO without an application being made.
- The Premises will be subject to ongoing compliance inspections and investigations following incidences and complaints, in accordance with the EP Act;
- If risk issues arise in relation to the Premises, the CEO may, depending on the circumstances:
  - amend the conditions of the Licence at any time;
  - in the event of an alleged offence, exercise enforcement powers under the EP Act, including an environmental protection notice; and

- in the event of a breach of licence conditions, revoke the Licence.

The Delegated Officer has reviewed the last three years compliance history. The Licence Holder has reported compliance with all conditions of the Licence for the last three years. A compliance inspection carried out by DWER in September 2016 did not identify any issues, and there have been no complaints received regarding the Premises in the last three years.

Considering the above, the Delegated Officer has extended the Licence duration by 20 years in accordance with the *Guidance Statement: Licence Duration*.

### **Licence Holder's comments**

The Licence Holder was provided with a draft amendment notice on 25 January 2018 and did not provide any comments.

### **Amendment**

1. The Licence expiry date is amended from *5 February 2016* to *4 February 2036*.
