Amendment Notice

This notice is issued under section 59 of the Environmental Protection Act 1986 (EP Act) to amend the licence issued under the EP Act for a prescribed premises as set out below. This notice of amendment is given under section 59B(9) of the EP Act.

Amendment Description

This amendment was initiated by Wesfeeds Pty Ltd (Licence Holder) who lodged an application for licence amendment (Application) on 21 November 2016 in relation to Licence L8459/2010/3 for a Category 22 Animal feed manufacturing premises.

The Licence Holder requested amendments to the following aspects of the licence and for the reasons outlined below.

1. Amendment of Licence Holder details

The Licence Holder is a subsidiary of the Body Corporate George Weston Foods Limited which has undergone structural changes. The Licence Holder requested the licence be altered to reflect George Weston Foods Limited (ACN 008 429 632) as the licence holder. The Licence Holder also advised the business was now known as Weston Animal Nutrition.

2. Production increase

The Licence Holder seeks to increase the production/design capacity specified on page 1 of the licence from 200,000 tonnes per year to 320,000 tonnes per year. The Licence Holder estimates the increase will occur over the course of the next 6 to 7 years through longer operating hours and resuming some activities within South Mill that were scaled back as part of the upgrade and transfer of operations to North Mill.

The Licence Holder submitted addendum information received by DER on 22 December 2016 regarding South Mill including infrastructure, sources of emissions, and controls for emissions. Activities and equipment in South Mill are for the receipt of raw materials, grinding, batching and mixing, pelleting, and bulk loadout. These are existing activities within South Mill operating as part of the pellet mill processing requirements for North Mill.

Infrastructure and equipment in South Mill is fitted with separate or centralised baghouse dust collectors. The Licence Holder provided a list of existing baghouse units for South Mill as extracted from baghouse information received by DER on 8 August 2016 to meet the requirements of condition 20 of the licence. The Licence Holder has not proposed any changes to the existing baghouse dust collector network.

Decision

The Delegated Officer has granted the amendments sought by the Licence Holder. In determining to increase the production/design capacity of the licence to 320,000 tonnes per year, the Delegated Officer did not impose additional regulatory controls on the licence, noting that the current licence was assessed on the basis of the site operating 24 hours a day.

The Delegated Officer noted there were no proposed changes to the infrastructure and equipment, including South Mill, in order to increase the production to 320,000 tonnes per year. The production increase is to be achieved primarily through increasing South Mill operating hours for existing activities. The decision not to impose additional regulatory controls is consistent with the *Guidance Statement: Regulatory Principles* on the basis that there is no expected change to the risk profile of emissions and there are existing regulatory controls on the licence that are adequate to ensure there is not an unacceptable risk of harm to public health or environment. The existing controls have been applied consistent with the *Guidance Statement: Risk Assessments* and *Guidance Statement: Setting Conditions*.

The Delegated Officer noted the Licence Holder was not proposing to carry out any actions that fall within sections 53(1)(a) to (e) or section 53(2)(a) to (b) of the EP Act in order to achieve the production increase.
