The provided ASIC extract is not sufficient or detailed enough. Part 2.9 requires the attachment of ASIC extract 1B to be "A current company information extract (not the company information summary) purchased from the ASIC website(s) for all new applications / registrations has been provided and labelled as Attachment 1B." Without a full ASIC extract, the names and signatures of directors signing the form could not be verified, and the writing of the names was not legible. Further information is required on the applicants proposed controls to mitigate potential impacts to the environment from the discharge of dewater, including downstream or nearby receptors such as native vegetation in the vicinity of the discharge point.
