1. Application summary

On 3 February 2022, Soft Star Pty Limited (Licence Holder) applied to renew licence L8799/2013/1 as it is due to expire on 3 April 2022. The Premises is located at Lot 3051 and Lot 3052 on Deposited Plan 46328, Waterfall Bay, Christmas Island. The licence relates to prescribed premises categories as described below in Table 1.

Soft Star Pty Ltd owns the Christmas Island Resort (which houses up to 300 people) and the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) which is located approximately 500m north of the resort. The WWTP is leased by Soft Star Pty Ltd from the Commonwealth of Australia. As the Resort remains non-operational, the WWTP continues to be in care and maintenance.

The Resort uses an Intermittent Decanted Extended Aeration (IDEA) sewage system at the WWTP to manage the effluent from the resort prior to discharge via an ocean outfall pipe to the Indian Ocean, off Christmas Island. The facility has a maximum treatment capacity of 125 cubic metres per day (m^3 /day), however the volume currently being treated is closer to 90 m^3 /day.

The Premises remains in care and maintenance as the Resort is not operational.

2. Regulatory framework

The Delegated Officer has determined to undertake an administrative renewal of the licence and has not conducted a full review and risk assessment of emissions and discharges from the Premises in line with the department's *Work Instruction: Regulatory Services, COVID-19 licensing position* June 2021.

In replacing the licence, the Delegated Officer has considered and given due regard to the department's regulatory framework and relevant policy documents which are available at https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents.

3. Decision summary

Under the regulatory framework the Delegated Officer has determined to grant the licence L8799/2013/2 without conducting any risk assessment.

The licence will be issued for 20 years with an expiry date of 3 April 2042 consistent with the *Guidance Statement: Licence Duration 2016.*

In renewing the licence the Delegated Officer has determined to:

- update the format and appearance of the licence;
- remove redundant conditions;
- include conditions considered necessary for the effective administration of the licence (i.e. record keeping and reporting requirements);
- revise licence conditions and consolidate existing pollution control conditions;
- include all infrastructure into condition 1, Table 1: infrastructure and equipment

requirements;

- correct clerical mistakes and unintentional errors; and
- transfer all existing regulatory controls and conditions to the renewed licence.

3.1 Summary of administrative changes

Section 62 of the EP Act provides general power to impose conditions on licences. All licences are issued with conditions as per *Guidance Statement* – *Setting Conditions* (October 2015) for the purposes of the EP Act to prevent, control, abate or mitigate pollution or environmental harm.

Table summarises the transfer of all appropriate conditions from the expiring licence into the revised licence including changes made to licence conditions where required and the rationale for changes made.
