1. Decision summary

The Delegated Officer has determined to make amendments to licence L5425/1989/11. The amendments are administrative in nature therefore they do not alter the risk profile of the premises, providing that activities, emissions and receptors as stated in existing approvals remain unchanged. This Amendment Report documents the amendments made pursuant to section 59 and 59(B) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act).

2. Scope of assessment

2.1 Regulatory framework

In amending the licence, the department has considered and given due regard to its Regulatory Framework and relevant policy documents which are available at https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents.

2.2 Amendment summary

Licence L5425/1989/11 is held by Iluka Resources Ltd (licence holder) for the Narngulu Mineral Separation Plant (the premises), located at Lot 2 (Plan 11238) and Lot 202 (Plan 59617), Narngulu WA 6532. The premises relates to the category and the assessed production/design capacity under Schedule 1 of the *Environmental Protection Regulations* 1987 (EP Regulations) which are defined in existing licence L5425/1989/11.

On 10 August 2020, the department initiated an amendment to licence L5425/1989/11. The amendment is limited to extending the licence expiry date.

The department is currently undertaking the assessment of the licence renew application L5425/1989/11, which was submitted 22 June 2020.

The current licence is due to expire 3 September 2020, and assessment of the licence renew may not be finalised prior to the current expiration date. The expiry of the current licence is therefore extended for 3 months, to allow sufficient time to finalise and issue the renewed licence. The undertaken amendment is set out in Table 1.

The assessment of the licence renew application will continue and timeframes are not affected by this licence amendment.
