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1. Decision summary

Licence L6092/1972/12 is held by Nufarm Australia Limited (Licence Holder) for the premises located at 1 Mason Road, Kwinana Beach (the Premises).

This Amendment Report documents the assessment of potential risks to the environment and public health from proposed changes to the emissions and discharges during the operation of the Premises. As a result of this assessment, Revised Licence L6092/1972/12 has been granted.

2. Scope of assessment

2.1 Regulatory framework

In completing the assessment documented in this Amendment Report, the department has considered and given due regard to its Regulatory Framework and relevant policy documents which are available at https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents.

2.2 Application summary

On 30 June 2025, the Licence Holder submitted an application to the department to amend Licence L6092/1972/1 under section 59 and 59B of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act). The following amendments are being sought:

- To include highly active molecule (HAM) Plant vent stack with activated carbon scrubber into the list of emission points.
- Map of emission points in Schedule 1 updated

The HAM Plant vent stack was installed in 2011 and overlooked in the licence renewal in 2014.

2.3 Process

The HAM herbicide formulations consist of finely ground active ingredient particles dissolved in either aqueous or solvent based solutions that include surfactants and pH buffering agents. The active powders added to the formulation vessels are classified as Combustible Dusts and are charged using a venturi-eductor to prevent a possible combustible dust explosion.

The ventilation system consists of a 200mm horizontal header duct with branches to each of four vessels within the HAM Plant. The branches remove air and vapour that is displaced when the vessels are filled with raw materials or product from another vessel. There is a ventilation branch to a plenum fitted to a filling machine used for packaging product and additional branches to points where vapour is generated when pumping liquids from 200L drums, IBCs and when washing empty 200L drums.

Scrubber has a granulated activate carbon (GAC) filter for adsorption of emitted vapours.

2.4 Emissions Monitoring

The Licence Holder has provided the Department with stack monitoring results for the scrubber and they reveal that emissions VOCs are consistently less than a gram per second.

3. Risk assessment

The department assesses the risks of emissions from prescribed premises and identifies the potential source, pathway and impact to receptors in accordance with the *Guideline: Risk assessments* (DWER 2020).

To establish a Risk Event there must be an emission, a receptor which may be exposed to that emission through an identified actual or likely pathway, and a potential adverse effect to the receptor from exposure to that emission.

3.1 Source-pathways and receptors

3.1.1 Emissions and controls

The key emissions and associated actual or likely pathway during premises operation which have been considered in this Amendment Report are detailed in Table 1 below. Table 1 also details the proposed control measures the Licence Holder has proposed to assist in controlling these emissions, where necessary.

3.1.2 Receptors

In accordance with the *Guideline: Risk assessments* (DWER 2020), the Delegated Officer has excluded employees, visitors and contractors of the Licence Holder's from its assessment. Protection of these parties often involves different exposure risks and prevention strategies, and is provided for under other state legislation.

Table 2 below provides a summary of potential human and environmental receptors that may be impacted as a result of activities upon or emission and discharges from the prescribed premises (*Guideline: Environmental siting* (DWER 2020)).

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3.2 Risk ratings

Risk ratings have been assessed in accordance with the *Guideline: Risk Assessments* (DWER 2020) for those emission sources which are proposed to change and takes into account potential source-pathway and receptor linkages as identified in Section 3.1. Where linkages are incomplete they have not been considered further in the risk assessment.

Where the Licence Holder has proposed mitigation measures/controls (as detailed in Section 3.1), these have been considered when determining the final risk rating. Where the Delegated Officer considers the Licence Holder's proposed controls to be critical to maintaining an acceptable level of risk, these will be incorporated into the licence as regulatory controls.

Additional regulatory controls may be imposed where the Licence Holder's controls are not deemed sufficient. Where this is the case the need for additional controls will be documented and justified in Table 3.

The Revised Licence L6092/1972/12 that accompanies this Amendment Report authorises emissions associated with the operation of the Premises i.e. pesticide manufacturing activities.

The conditions in the Revised Licence have been determined in accordance with *Guidance Statement: Setting Conditions* (DER 2015).

5. Decision

The delegated officer has assessed the application and determined that the request to incorporate emission point A8 into the licence is appropriate and will not impact the risk profile of the premises. In reaching this conclusion the delegated officer has considered the following:

- A8 includes a GAC scrubber to remove any volatile organic compounds emitted.
- A8 and the scrubber have been in operation since 2011.
- The 1.7 kilometres separating the plant from sensitive receptors.
- The ongoing emission testing of A8 shows low emissions of VOCs and Ammonia.

6. Conclusion

Based on the assessment in this Amendment Report, the Delegated Officer has determined that a Revised Licence will be granted, subject to conditions commensurate with the determined controls and necessary for administration and reporting requirements.

6.1 Summary of amendments

Table 5 provides a summary of the proposed amendments and will act as record of implemented changes. All proposed changes have been incorporated into the Revised Licence as part of the amendment process.
