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## 1. Decision summary

Licence L7288/1998/11 is held by the Shire of Moora (Licence Holder) for the Moora Townsite Rubbish Tip (the Premises), located at Lot 3996 on Plan 181345 and Lot 1 on Diagram 42691, Moora.

This Amendment Report documents the assessment of potential risks to the environment and public health from proposed changes to the emissions and discharges during the operation of the Premises.

As a result of this assessment, Revised Licence L7288/1998/11 has been granted.

## 2. Scope of assessment

#### 2.1 Regulatory framework

In completing the assessment documented in this Amendment Report, the department has considered and given due regard to its Regulatory Framework and relevant policy documents which are available at <a href="https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents">https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents</a>.

### 2.2 Application summary

On 30 July 2020 the Licence Holder applied to the department to amend Licence L7288/14998/11/1 under section 59 and 59B of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act). The amendments being sought relate to the addition of Category 62 to allow for the container deposit scheme (CDS) to operate at the Premises.

In accordance with section 53 of the EP Act, alterations to a prescribed premises must be done so in accordance with a works approval, licence, closure notice or environmental protection notice (or amendments thereof). In accordance with DWER's *Industry Regulation Guide to Licensing* (June 2019), the Delegated Officer has determined that alterations to the premises to include CDS operations are appropriately facilitated via a licence amendment (which is the subject of this amendment report).

Table 1 below outlines the proposed changes to the existing Licence.

As part of this amendment package the department has updated the format and condition wording of the licence, in particular improving the descriptions of the waste types which can be accepted at the Premises. The obligations of the Licence Holder have not changed in updating the licence. The department has not undertaken any additional risk assessment of the Premises related to previously approved activities.

#### 3. Risk assessment

The department assesses the risks of emissions from prescribed premises and identifies the potential source, pathway and impact to receptors in accordance with the *Guidance Statement: Risk Assessments* (DER 2017).

To establish a Risk Event there must be an emission, a receptor which may be exposed to that emission through an identified actual or likely pathway, and a potential adverse effect to the receptor from exposure to that emission.

## 3.1 Source-pathways and receptors

#### 3.1.1 Emissions and controls

The key emissions and associated actual or likely pathway(s) during premises operation which have been considered in this Amendment Report are detailed in Table 2 below. Table 2 also details the proposed control measures the Licence Holder has proposed to assist in controlling these emissions, where necessary as well as the current operational controls at the premises.

#### 3.1.2 Receptors

In accordance with the *Guidance Statement: Risk Assessment* (DER 2017), the Delegated Officer has excluded employees, visitors and contractors of the Licence Holder's from its assessment. Protection of these parties often involves different exposure risks and prevention strategies, and is provided for under other state legislation.

Table 3 below provides a summary of potential human and environmental receptors that may be impacted as a result of activities upon or emission and discharges from the prescribed premises (Guidance Statement: Environmental Siting (DER 2016)).

## 3.2 Risk ratings

Risk ratings have been assessed in accordance with the *Guidance Statement: Risk*Assessments (DER 2017) for those emission sources which are proposed to change and takes into account potential source-pathway and receptor linkages as identified in Section 3.1. Where linkages are in-complete they have not been considered further in the risk assessment.

Where the Licence Holder has proposed mitigation measures/controls (as detailed in Section 3.1), these have been considered when determining the final risk rating. Where the Delegated Officer considers the Licence Holder's proposed controls to be critical to maintaining an acceptable level of risk, these will be incorporated into the licence as regulatory controls.

Additional regulatory controls may be imposed where the Licence Holder's controls are not deemed sufficient. Where this is the case the need for additional controls will be documented and justified in Table 4.

The Revised Licence L7288/1998/11 that accompanies this Amendment Report authorises emissions associated with the operation of the Premises i.e. increased throughput and container deposit scheme activities.

The conditions in the Revised Licence have been determined in accordance with *Guidance Statement: Setting Conditions* (DER 2015).
