1. Decision summary

Under the regulatory framework the Delegated Officer decided to process the application to renew licence L8050/1991/3 without conducting any additional risk assessment.

The licence can be issued for 20 years, which is consistent with the *Guidance Statement* on *Licence Duration 2016*. In renewing the licence the Delegated Officer has determined to:

- update the format and appearance of the licence;
- correct clerical mistakes and unintentional errors; and
- transfer all existing regulatory controls and conditions to the new licence.

As a result of the above, the Delegated Officer decided to grant Licence L8050/1991/4, subject to conditions set out in the attached licence.

2. Scope of assessment

2.1 Application summary

On 18 July 2023, Water Corporation (licence holder) applied to renew licence L8050/1991/3, as the licence is due to expire on 31 October 2023. The licence was granted to the licence holder for the premises located at Airstrip Road, Jurien Road (Premises).

The licence relates to prescribed premises categories as described in Table 1.

Table 1: Premises category description and production design capacity

Prescribed premises category description (Schedule 1, Environmental Protection Regulations 1987)	Production / design capacity
Category 54: Sewage facility premises – (a) on which sewage is treated (excluding septic tanks); or (b) from which treated sewage is discharged onto land or into waters.	300 cubic metres per day
Category 61: Liquid waste facility – premises on which liquid waste produced on other premises (other than sewerage waste) is stored, reprocessed, treated or irrigated.	150 cubic metres per day

The Jurien Bay WWTP is a secondary treatment facility with a design capacity to treat 300 cubic metres per day of sewage. The facility also accepts 150 cubic metres per day of D300 non-toxic salts into the infiltration pond.

The WWTP treats wastewater to a secondary standard and includes the following treatment processes:

- Preliminary (1, 1B) treatment (two primary (facultative) ponds);
- Secondary (2, 2B) treatment (two secondary (maturation) ponds);
- Treated wastewater infiltration (three infiltration ponds); and
- Sludge treatment and dewatering.

3. Regulatory framework

The Delegated Officer has not conducted a full review and risk assessment of emissions and discharges from the Premises in line with the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation's (department) *Work Instruction: Regulatory Services, COVID-19 licensing position* October 2021.

In granting the licence, the Delegated Officer has considered and given due regard to the department's regulatory framework and relevant policy documents which are available at https://dwer.wa.gov.au/regulatory-documents.

4. Considerations for issuing a new licence

4.1 Compliance and enforcement actions

There has been one non-compliance identified at the Premises by the department in the last five years relating to an Annual Environment Report. No enforcement actions taken against the occupier in the last 5 years regarding the licence.

4.2 Legal occupancy

The licence holder has demonstrated legal occupancy of the Premises.

4.3 Categories of the licence

The requested categories and the corresponding maximum production capacities for the renewal of the licence are consistent with the categories for which the licence holder currently holds a licence and which was previously assessed.

4.4 Planning approval

Under Section 137 of the *Water Services Act 2012*, the Water Corporation is a public entity under the *Planning Development Act 2005* and is therefore exempt from development approval.

5. Summary of changes to the licence conditions

Section 62 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act) provides the legal power to attach conditions to a licence. Most licenses are issued with conditions as per *Guidance Statement* – *Setting Conditions* (October 2015) to prevent, control, abate or mitigate pollution or environmental harm resulting from emissions and/or discharges from this premises.

Table 2 summarises the changes from the expiring licence into the new licence including changes made to licence conditions where required and the rationale for changes made.
