



CEO-initiated amendment to licence

1. Decision summary

The delegated officer has determined to amend licence L8120/2006/4 and to amalgamate Amendment Notices 1 and 2 into the new licence. The amendment is administrative in nature and therefore does not alter the risk profile of the premises, providing that activities, emissions and receptors as stated in existing approvals remain unchanged.

This report documents the amendments made pursuant to section 59 and 59(B) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act).

The decision report for the existing licence will remain on the department's website for future reference and will act as a record of the department's decision making.

2. Scope of assessment

2.1 Regulatory framework

In amending the licence, the department has considered and given due regard to its regulatory framework and relevant policy documents which are available at [DWER Regulatory documents | Western Australian Government \(www.wa.gov.au\)](https://www.wa.gov.au/government/publications/dwer-regulatory-documents).

2.2 Amendment summary

Nationwide Oil Pty Ltd (NWO) operate an oil recycling facility at the old Loongana Lime plant at Parkeston, about 2.5 km east of Kalgoorlie (NWO Parkeston facility).

The premises is located on a portion of Hampton Location 33, Yarri Road, Kalgoorlie. The NWO facility is surrounded by industry on Yarri Road in Parkeston. Access to the premises is via Yarri Road and then an internal road through the Loongana Lime Plant site. The premises is in a highly disturbed semi-arid area and is surrounded by natural vegetation in various stages of degradation.

The existing licence is due to expire on 19 August 2025 – the department considers there is insufficient time to complete a licence renewal process and has therefore initiated an amendment to extend its duration. No reassessment of risk has therefore been undertaken at this time. The department intends to defer the review and renewal of the premises licence for a period of five years (due to lease agreement) by amending the expiry date to 19/8/2030.

3. Consultation

The draft licence and draft amendment report were provided to the licence holder on 15 July 2025. No comment was received.

4. Decision

Section 63 of the EP Act prescribes that a licence shall continue in force for such period as is specified in the licence. L8120/2006/4 is due to expire on 19/08/2025. The delegated officer considers it appropriate to extend the licence duration by five years.

In determining to extend the duration of the licence by five years, the following matters were considered by the delegated officer:

- the risk profile of the premises was last considered for Amendment Notice 1 - Licence holder-initiated amendment to remove conditions that are no applicable to premises operations;
- there has been no enforcement action or complaints received by the department relating to the operation of the premises in the last five years;
- an extension to the duration of the licence will not change the current risk profile of the premises, and the risks posed by ongoing emissions from the premises will continue to be subject to the existing licence conditions;

- the licence holder has continued access to the premises for the duration of the extension of the licence duration as the lease is still valid;
- *Guidance Statement: Licence duration* (2016) provides for licences to be issued for a term of up to 20 years however the licence holder has advised that a period of five years may be more appropriate as they are uncertain of continued operations at the premises beyond five years; and
- in the event that risk issues arise in relation to the premises, the CEO may:
 - amend the licence conditions at any point; and
 - in the event of an alleged offence, exercise enforcement powers under the provisions of the EP Act.

5. Conclusion

5.1 Summary of amendments

Table 1 below provides a summary of the proposed amendments and will act as a record of implemented changes. All proposed changes have been incorporated into the amended licence as part of the amendment process.
