# 2. Amendment description

Licence L8660/2012/1 is held by FQM Australia Nickel Pty Ltd (Licence Holder) for the Ravensthorpe Nickel Project Tamarine Quarry (the Premises), located at Mining Tenement M74/220.

The Premises relates to category 12 (Screening) and the assessed 800,000 tonnes per year production/design capacity under Schedule 1 of the *Environmental Protection Regulations* 1987 (EP Regulations) which are defined in existing licence L8660/2012/1.

The Ravensthorpe Nickel Operation has been in care and maintenance since 9 October 2017. Therefore, the Tamarine quarry, that provides limestone as an input into the nickel operation, has not operated.

The Tamarine quarry licence is due to expire on 29 September 2020. Given the premises is still in care and maintenance, DWER has decided to initiate this licence amendment to extend the licence duration.

This amendment is made pursuant to section 59 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act) to amend the licence issued under the EP Act for a prescribed premises as set out below. This notice of amendment is given under section 59B(9) of the EP Act.

This amendment is limited to an extension of the licence expiry date by a period of five years.

The decision report for the Existing licence will remain on the department's website for future

reference and will act as a record of the department's decision making.

In amending the licence, the department has considered and given due regard to its Regulatory Framework and relevant policy documents which are available at <a href="https://www.der.wa.gov.au">https://www.der.wa.gov.au</a>.

## 3. Consultation

The Licence Holder was provided with the draft Amended Licence and Amendment Report on 4 June 2020. By the 15 July 2020, no comment had been received from the Licence Holder, therefore the Delegated Officer has proceeded to determine the Amendment.

### 4. Conclusion

The Delegated Officer has determined to make an amendment to licence L8860/2012/1 to extend the duration of the licence by five years. The amendment is administrative in nature therefore it does not alter the risk profile of the Premises providing that activities, emissions and receptors as stated in existing approvals remain unchanged.

This amendment does not propose any alteration to the production, design capacity, prescribed activity or discharge locations approved under the existing licence. The amendment will extend the expiry date of the licence by five years. The licence will now expires on 29 September 2025.
