Discharge of water from LCDM (Jacko's Dam) in exceedance of water quality trigger criteria values for TDS, Magnesium and Sulfate. These elevated parameters are from a well understood source of Acid Metalliferous Drainage (AMD) that has been fully considered in the context of Mine Closure.							
What was the actual (o	r suspected) env	vironmental impact of the non-o	compliance?				
There was no evidence of environmental impact associated with the trigger exceedance. No exceedances of licence criteria were observed at downstream sample locations (LCSPRGS & LCLBGS), with water quality results at these downstream locations remaining consistent with historical values.							
Cause (or suspected c	ause) of non-cor	mpliance:					
Cessation of mining and dewatering prevented dilution of seepage water in Jacko's Dam, leading to criteria exceedance. Decommissioning of infrastructure and processing facilities as part of closure decreased the need for water onsite, and water that was previously recycled through processing water use had to be discharged.							
In accordance with the Mine Closure Plan, Jacko's Dam/LCDM will be removed as part of the closure works, yet to be completed. A spillway will be excavated and armoured in the existing dam embankment, so that the dam will be free draining. Areas of embankment greater than 20 degrees will be reprofiled and the area will be ripped and seeded. All other infrastructure will be removed.

There were no adverse of	effects associated	l with the non-compliance requirin	g mitigation.				
The licence was amended on 8 <sup>th</sup> September 2023 to remove monitoring locations LCDM, Reclaim Pond 2B (RCP2B), and Limestone Creek Lease Boundary Gauging Station (LCLBGS) as compliance monitoring locations.							
The downstream location of LCSPRGS will be used as the compliance point going forth.
