Recorded SWLs for PWD2 fluctuated up and down within a 1.5m range during the reporting period, but overall remained within the long-term monitoring trend. Despite failure to measure PWD2 as part of the January 2021 sampling event, the SWL between October 2020 and July 2021 reported only ~0.18m difference, therefore impact to the receiving environment is considered negligible.				
Cause (or suspecte	ed cause) of non-compliance:			
On the occasion the SWL was not measured the water level meter had broken, resulting in SWL not being taken.				
Action taken to mitigate any adverse effects of non-compliance and prevent recurrence of the non-compliance:				
A new water level meter was purchased to ensure future SWL measurements could be taken in accordance with the schedule.

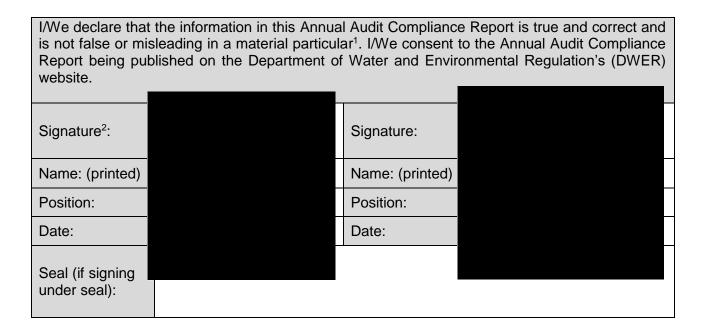

NDVI outputs for the months surrounding the missed periods were consistent with monitoring trend, showing only slight variations. The weekly photographic monitoring of the same area was still conducted as per the Licence conditions which is considered a reliable method to identify changes in vegetation condition. During the months that NDVI was not completed, weekly photo monitoring and field inspection notes confirm the vegetation condition/establishment, or loss appeared to be consistent with the established monitoring trend. Based on the monthly (x 8) UAV NDVI and weekly (52) field photo monitoring reported during the period, the environmental impact of the non-compliance is considered negligible. Despite the missed monitoring events, the combined dataset is considered robust to assess the environmental performance/impact associated with the Maid Marion discharge to land.				
Cause (or suspected cause) of non-compliance:				
During the months NDVI vegetation monitoring did not occur the drone was damaged and was offsite for specialist repairs/maintenance. BBGO owns only this one drone equipped with a suitable camera attachment and capabilities for conducting this specialist NDVI monitoring.				
Action taken to mitigate any adverse effects of non-compliance and prevent recurrence of the non-compliance:				
NDVI flight was conducted as soon as the drone was repaired. BBGO to implement a maintenance strategy to maximise drone availability for environmental monitoring.

On the date photo point #2 was missed in the weekly photographic monitoring, all other photo points for the Maid Marion discharge were completed. Photo point #2 was recorded every other week as per the Licence condition. Comparisons before and after the missed date show no difference and therefore the actual or suspected impact to the quality of monitoring dataset or the receiving environment is considered negligible.

The cause for the non-compliance was simply human error, this photo point was not recorded on this particular date.

Review completed field sheet at the field monitoring location to ensure completion of all required data points and when uploading data conduct an additional QA/QC check. If required, remobilise to site to ensure compliance with the monitoring schedule.

During the reporting period, daily physical inspections/monitoring of Maid Marion discharge flows with respect to Meekatharra Water Reserve were not completed on two occasions in accordance with Condition 3.4.2, Table 14: Additional monitoring at ephemeral creek discharge location, for the two days below: Maid Marion discharge flows – 21/07/2021; and Maid Marion discharge flows – 27/08/2021. 				
What was the actua	al (or suspected) environmen	tal impact of the non-c	ompliance?

On both occasions the daily monitoring was missed, the discharge flows had stopped entering through the Great Northern Highway culvert (monitoring trigger) and no longer approaching the Meekatharra Water Reserve. Daily monitoring conducted the very next day shows the discharge flows had only further receded from the culvert. Based on this, the actual or suspected environmental impact of the non-compliance is negligible.				
Cause (or suspecte	ed cause) of non-compliance:			
On 21/07/2021 daily monitoring of the Maid Marion discharge flows was missed due to staff changeover/inexperience.				
On 27/08/2021 daily monitoring of the Maid Marion discharge flows was missed due to an unrelated incident on site requiring attention.				
Action taken to mitigate any adverse effects of non-compliance and prevent recurrence of the non-compliance:				
Daily monitoring was conducted as required the next day following the missed monitoring. BBGO to continue to review monitoring requirements at daily and handover meetings, with specific reiteration attention during time of staff turnover/handover.
