The monthly Marandoo SWFSF water level monitoring was planned for completion in March 2024; however, due to resourcing constraints, three bores were not measured. As a contingency measure, groundwater measurements were conducted in early April to assess any potential deviations or unusual trends.

There were no adverse effects associated with the non-compliance requiring mitigation. In any case, the following actions have been taken to prevent recurrence:  1. Monitoring schedules were reviewed and prioritisation reinstated for SWSF compliance monitoring. No further instances of missed groundwater depth monitoring occurred during the reporting period.
