3. Measures Taken to Prevent Fires and Details of Any Fires at the Premises

There was no fires on the premises during the period 01 Jan 2019 to 31 December 2019. Fire extinguishers are available on-site, together with a front end loader if required. Mains water has been installed to the premises. On days where a Total Fire Ban has been declared, no pushing up of green waste will occur in accordance with the exemption granted by Fire and Emergency Services Authority pursuant to Section 22C of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*. A water suppression trailer is also available on site at any time.

4. Measures Taken to Control Pests and Vermin

There are no specific measures taken to control pests and vermin. All material deposited at the transfer station (other than green waste and some dry recyclable materials) is transported to the Red Hill Waste Management Facility for burial on the same day it is received. Therefore, conditions likely to attract and harbour pests and vermin are not created and pests or vermin are not encountered at the site.

5. Measures Taken to Suppress Dust

There are no specific measures taken to suppress dust at the site. The majority of activities undertaken on the premises to not create significant

quantities of dust. Shredding of stockpiled green waste can generate some dust. This activity is undertaken at times when the facility is closed to the public and there are significant vegetated buffers to residential areas to ensure that dust nuisance is minimal.

6. Measures Taken to Control Windblown Waste

All windblown waste is retained within the premises by the fencing surrounding the waste transfer station waste receivable bay and sorting/loading area. Such waste is collected as required by facility staff.

7. Average Compaction Rates

The inert waste (type 1) is no longer buried or compacted at the facility and has been removed and disposed off site for the period 01 Jan 2019 to 31 December 2019. The volumes are surveyed quarterly and presented to the Waste Management Branch of Department of Environment and Conservation as part of the Shire's quarterly landfill levy return.

8. Complaints Summary

There were no complaints received in relation to the operations at the premises during the period 01 Jan 2019 to 31 December 2019.
