
Ambient groundwater monitoring bore MAMB02 (associated with Margaret Pit emission point reference) had standing water levels (SWL) of 3.76 mbgl on 8 January 2024 and SWL of 3.77mbgl on 7 April 2024. This follows an initial non-compliance detected for SWL on 2nd December, 2023.

The Porphyry Operating Licence limit is 4 mbgl for the pit monitoring bores.

In December 2023 there was a SWL exceedance with this bore that was reported to DWER through N1 form submission. Management action taken was to reduce discharge of water to Margarets pit and weekly vegetation monitoring until compliance was achieved on 16 February 2024. However, in March 2024 the SWL was 3.77 mbgl. Since the N1 submission we have been observing the SWL's of this bore in the reporting period to ascertain if the SWL will improve. We observed that since the last exceedance on April 2024 to the end of the reporting period the SWL of this bore has not exceeded the licence limit.

Section E – Details of non-compliance with licence condition		
Cause (or suspected cause) of non-compliance:		
The monitoring of the volume of licensed mine dewater discharge into Margarets Pit was inadequate, following on from the December 2023 exceedance.		
Action taken to mitigate any adverse effects of non-compliance and prevent recurrence of the non-compliance:		
Following detection of the December 2023 non-compliance, all mine dewater into Margarets Pit was reduced and redirected into an alternate emission point to land as per the operating licence. Standing water level monitoring and photo point vegetation monitoring was performed weekly from detection of non-compliance until compliance was achieved on 16 February 2024. Following the March 2024 non-compliance, discharge to Margarets pit was reduced until it stopped altogether in August 2024, refer to AER Table 5.
