Interpretation

In this licence:

Licence conditions

The licence holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

Infrastructure and equipment

1. The licence holder must ensure that the site infrastructure and equipment listed in Table 1 is maintained and operated in accordance with the corresponding operational requirement set out in Table 1.

Waste Acceptance

2. The licence holder must only accept onto the premises waste of a type that:

 - (b) meets the relevant acceptance specification, as set out in Table 2.

Waste Processing

4. The licence holder must ensure that the waste types specified in Table 3 are only subjected to the corresponding processes, subject to the corresponding process limits and/or specifications.

Emissions and Discharges

5. The licence holder must ensure that sediment laden stormwater resulting from concrete crushing is not discharged outside Chevron's lease area.
6. The licence holder must ensure that dust emitted from the premises does not unreasonably interfere with the health, welfare, convenience, comfort, or amenity of any person who is not on the premises.

Monitoring

7. The licence holder must record the total amount of material:
- (a) accepted onto the premises;
 - (b) currently stored on the premises; and
 - (c) removed from the premises,
- for the material types listed in Table 4, in the corresponding unit, and for each corresponding time period set out in Table 4.

Records and reporting

8. The licence holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the licence holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
 - (a) the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided);
 - (b) the time and date of the complaint;
 - (c) the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
 - (d) the complete details and dates of any action taken by the licence holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.
9. The licence holder must:
 - (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the conditions of this licence during the preceding annual period; and
 - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO an Annual Audit Compliance Report in the approved form by 31 August 2023.
10. The licence holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this licence:
 - (a) the calculation of fees payable in respect of this licence;
 - (b) any maintenance of infrastructure that is performed in the course of complying with condition 1 of this licence;
 - (c) monitoring programs undertaken in accordance with condition 7 of this licence; and
 - (d) complaints received under condition 8 of this licence.
11. The books specified under condition 10 must:
 - (a) be legible;
 - (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
 - (c) be retained by the licence holder for the duration of the licence; and
 - (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.
