Interpretation

 - (i) if dated, refers to that particular version; and
 - (ii) if not dated, refers to the latest version and therefore may be subject to change over time;
- (e) unless specified otherwise, any reference to a section of an Act refers to that section of the EP Act; and
- (f) unless specified otherwise, all definitions are in accordance with the EP Act.

NOTE: This works approval requires specific conditions to be met but does not provide any implied authorisation for other emissions, discharges, or activities not specified in this works approval.

Works approval conditions

The works approval holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

Construction phase

Infrastructure and equipment

- **1.** The works approval holder must:
 - (a) construct the infrastructure.
 - (b) in accordance with the corresponding design and construction requirements; and
 - (c) at the corresponding infrastructure location

as set out in Table 1.

Compliance reporting

- 2. The works approval holder must within 30 calendar days of an item of infrastructure or equipment required by condition 1 being constructed:
 - (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the requirements of condition 1; and
 - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO an Environmental Compliance Report on that compliance.

- **3.** The Environmental Compliance Report required by condition 2, must include as a minimum the following:
 - (a) certification by a suitably qualified geotechnical or civil engineer that the items of infrastructure or component(s) thereof, as specified in condition 1, have been constructed in accordance with the relevant requirements specified in condition 1.
 - (b) as constructed plans and a detailed site plan for each item of infrastructure or component of infrastructure specified in condition 1; and
 - (c) be signed by a person authorised to represent the works approval holder and contains the printed name and position of that person.

Environmental commissioning phase

Environmental commissioning requirements

- **4.** The works approval holder may only commence environmental commissioning of the Bellevue Gold Paste Plant infrastructure listed in condition 1 once the Environmental Compliance Report has been submitted for that infrastructure in accordance with condition 3 of this works approval.
- 5. Any environmental commissioning activities undertaken for an item of infrastructure specified in Table 2 may only be carried out:

(a) in accordance with the corresponding commissioning requirements; and

(b) for the corresponding authorised commissioning duration

Environmental commissioning report

- 6. The works approval holder must submit to the CEO an Environmental Commissioning Report within 14 calendar days of the completion date of environmental commissioning of the Bellevue Gold paste plant infrastructure specified in condition 5, Table 2.
- 7. The works approval holder must ensure the Environmental Commissioning Report required by condition 6 of this works approval includes the following.
 - (a) a summary of the environmental commissioning activities undertaken, including timeframes, amount of tailings processed and amount of bore water used.

- (b) a review of the works approval holder's performance and compliance against the conditions of this works approval; and
- (c) where they have not been met, measures proposed to meet the manufacturer's design specifications and the conditions of this works approval, together with timeframes for implementing the proposed measures.

Time limited operations phase

Commencement and duration

- 8. The works approval holder may commence time limited operations for the Bellevue Gold Paste Plant infrastructure as specified in condition 1 where the Environmental Commissioning Report for that stage of infrastructure as required by condition 6 has been submitted by the works approval holder.
- **9.** The works approval holder may conduct time limited operations for the Bellevue Gold Paste Plant infrastructure constructed as specified in condition 1:
 - (a) for a period not exceeding 180 calendar days from the day the works approval holder meets the requirements of condition 8 for that item of infrastructure: or
 - (b) until such time as a Licence for that item of infrastructure is granted in accordance with Part V of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*, if one is granted before the end of the period specified in condition 9(a).

Time limited operations requirements and emission limits

10. During time limited operations, the works approval holder must ensure that the premises infrastructure and equipment listed in Table 3 and located at the corresponding infrastructure location is maintained and operated in accordance with the corresponding operational requirement set out in Table 3.

Compliance reporting

- **11.** The works approval holder must submit to the CEO a report on the time limited operations within 30 calendar days of the completion date of time limited operations or 60 calendar days before the expiration date of the works approval, whichever is the sooner.
- **12.** The works approval holder must ensure the report required by condition 11 includes

the following:

- (a) a summary of the time limited operations, including timeframes, amount of tailings processed and amount of bore water used;
- (b) a review of performance and compliance against the conditions of the works approval; and
- (c) ambient groundwater results from monitoring bore MB01 (or nearest downgradient monitoring bore to the paste plant injection bore)
- (d) where the manufacture's design specifications and the conditions of this works approval have not been met, what measures will the works approval holder take to meet them, and what timeframes will be required to implement those measures.

Records and reporting (general)

- **13.** The works approval holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the works approval holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
 - (a) the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided).
 - (b) the time and date of the complaint.
 - (c) the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
 - (d) the complete details and dates of any action taken by the works approval holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.
- **14.** The works approval holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this works approval:
 - (a) the works conducted in accordance with condition 1.
 - (b) any maintenance of infrastructure that is performed in the course of complying with condition 10.
 - (c) complaints received under condition 13.
- **15.** The books specified under condition 14 must:
 - (a) be legible;
 - (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval.
 - (c) be retained by the works approval holder for the duration of the works approval; and
 - (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.


Premises map

Figure 2: General layout of Bellevue Gold paste plant






Figure 3: Location of paste plant, paste plant boreholes, and return water and tailings pipelines.
