## Interpretation

In this licence:

- (a) the words ‘including’, ‘includes’ and ‘include’ in conditions mean “including but not limited to”, and similar, as appropriate;
- (b) where any word or phrase is given a defined meaning, any other part of speech or other grammatical form of that word or phrase has a corresponding meaning;
- (c) where tables are used in a condition, each row in a table constitutes a separate condition;
- (d) any reference to an Australian or other standard, guideline, or code of practice in this licence:
  - (i) if dated, refers to that particular version; and
  - (ii) if not dated, refers to the latest version and therefore may be subject to change over time;
- (e) unless specified otherwise, any reference to a section of an Act refers to that section of the EP Act; and
- (f) unless specified otherwise, all definitions are in accordance with the EP Act.

**NOTE:** This licence requires specific conditions to be met but does not provide any implied authorisation for other emissions, discharges, or activities not specified in this licence.

## Licence conditions

The licence holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

### Infrastructure and equipment

- The licence holder must ensure that the site infrastructure and equipment listed in Table 1 and located at the corresponding infrastructure location is maintained and operated in accordance with the corresponding operational requirement set out in Table 1.

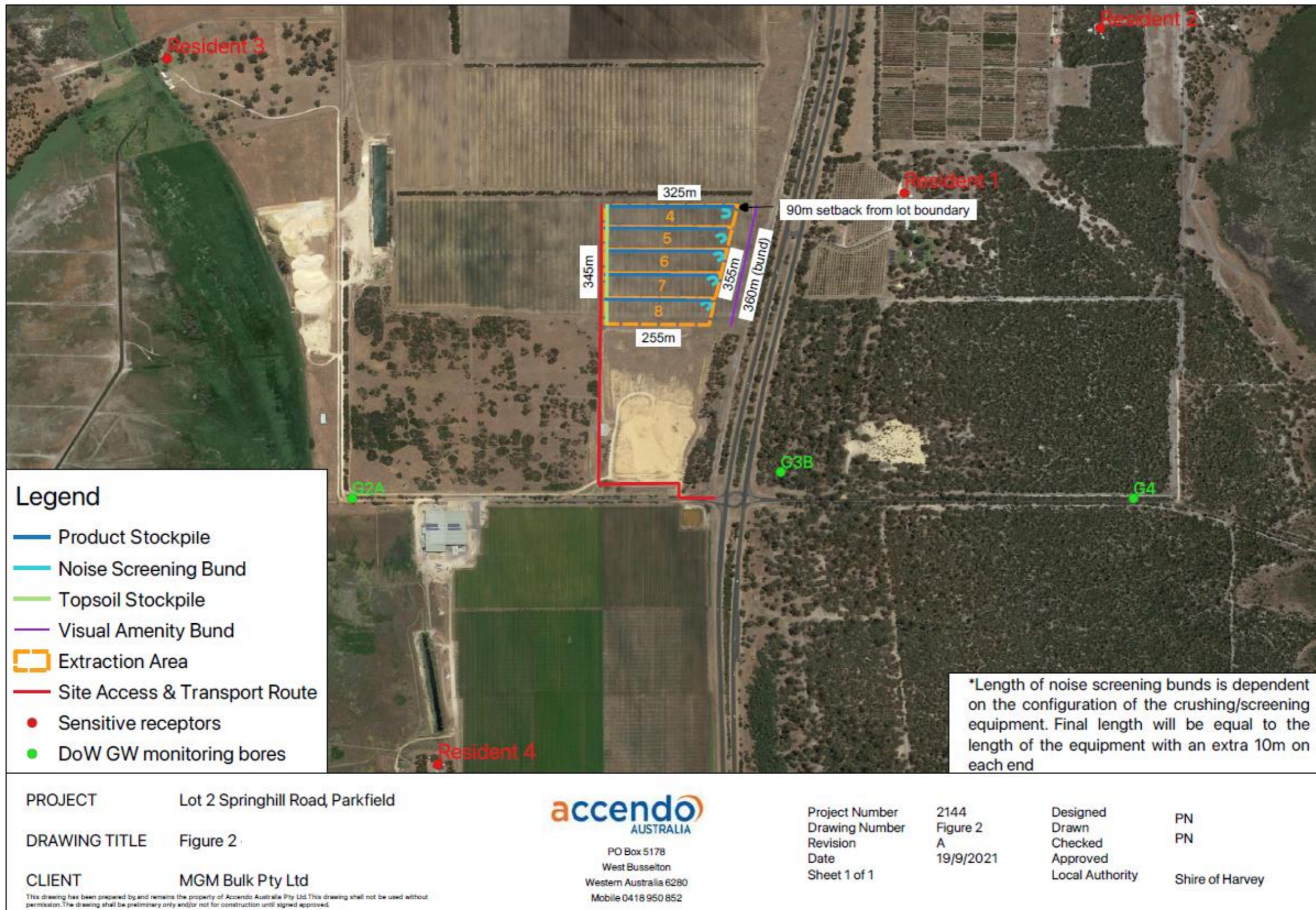


Figure 2: Map of the location of the noise bunds

Earthen noise bunds	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To be maintained immediately east of the operational crushing and screening plant for stages 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8;</li> <li>To be maintained at 5 metres height; and</li> <li>to be the length of the crushing and screening equipment in its final configuration, plus 10m at both ends.</li> </ol>	Located within premises boundary as shown in Figure 2, Schedule 1.

## Emissions and discharges

### Dust emissions

- The licence holder must ensure that no visible dust generated from the primary activities specified crosses the boundary of the premises.

3. The licence holder must ensure that:
  - (a) all product and waste stockpiles: and
  - (b) all raw material prior to being placed in the screening plantare wetted down using a water truck.
4. All stockpiles must be no more than 5 metres in height and be maintained in a damp state during operational hours.

### Stormwater emissions

5. The licence holder must take all practicable measures to prevent stormwater run-off becoming contaminated by the activities and operations undertaken at the premises.
6. The licence holder must manage stormwater runoff from crushing and screening operations so that contaminated or potentially contaminated water is captured and retained onsite to prevent release into the environment.
7. The licence holder shall immediately recover, or remove and dispose of, spills of environmentally hazardous material including fuel, oil or other hydrocarbons, whether inside or outside an engineered containment system.
8. The licence holder shall ensure that all material used for the recovery, removal, and/or disposal of environmentally hazardous materials is stored in an impermeable container prior to disposal at an appropriately authorised facility.

### Records and reporting

9. The licence holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the licence holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
  - (a) the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided);
  - (b) the time and date of the complaint;
  - (c) the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
  - (d) the complete details and dates of any action taken by the licence holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.
10. The licence holder must:
  - (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the conditions of this licence during the preceding annual period; and
  - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO by no later than 60 days after the end of that annual period an Annual Audit Compliance Report in the approved form.
11. The licence holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this licence:
  - (a) the calculation of fees payable in respect of this licence;
  - (b) any maintenance of infrastructure that is performed in the course of complying with condition 1 of this licence;

(c) complaints received under condition 9 of this licence.

**12.** The books specified under condition 11 must:

- (a) be legible;
- (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
- (c) be retained by the licence holder for the duration of the licence; and
- (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.

## Definitions
