Licence conditions

The licence holder must ensure that the following conditions are complied with:

Infrastructure and equipment

1. The licence holder must ensure that the site infrastructure and equipment listed in Table 1 and located at the corresponding infrastructure location is maintained and operated in accordance with the corresponding operational requirement set out in Table 1.

2. The licence holder must ensure that all pipelines containing saline or hypersaline water are provided with secondary containment adequate to contain any spill for a period equal to the time between routine inspections.

3. The licence holder must ensure that the emissions specified in Table 2, are discharged only from the corresponding discharge point and only at the corresponding discharge point location.

4. The licence holder must ensure that a minimum freeboard of six meters below crest level is maintained at all times within Surprise Pit.

Monitoring

- **5.** The licence holder must monitor emissions:
 - (a) from each discharge point;
 - (b) for the corresponding parameter;
 - (c) at the corresponding frequency;
 - (d) for the corresponding averaging period;
 - (e) in the corresponding unit; and
 - (f) using the corresponding method,

as set out in Table 3.

Records and reporting

Records

- 7. The licence holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the licence holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
 - (a) the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided);
 - (b) the time and date of the complaint;
 - (c) the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
 - (d) the complete details and dates of any action taken by the licence holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.
- **8.** The licence holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this licence:
 - (a) the calculation of fees payable in respect of this licence;
 - (b) any maintenance of infrastructure that is performed in the course of complying with condition 1 of this licence;
 - (c) monitoring programmes undertaken in accordance with condition 5 of this licence; and
 - (d) complaints received under condition 7 of this licence.
- **9.** The books specified under condition 8 must:
 - (a) be legible;

- (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
- (c) be retained by the licence holder for the duration of the licence; and
- (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.

Reporting

10. The licence holder must:

- (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the conditions of this licence during the preceding annual period, and
- (b) prepare and submit to the CEO an Annual Audit Compliance Report in the approved form by 1 September each year.

11. The licence holder must:

- (a) prepare an Environmental Report that provides information in accordance with Table 4 for the preceding annual period, and
- (b) submit that Environmental Report to the CEO by 1 September each year.




Figure 1: Map of the boundary of the prescribed premises




Figure 2: Prescribed activities infrastructure layout
