## Licence conditions

3. The Licence Holder must ensure that the actions listed in Table 3 are carried out in accordance with the corresponding requirement set out in Table 3.

4. The licence holder must manage stormwater runoff from screening operations so that contaminated or potentially contaminated stormwater is captured and retained on site to prevent release into the environment.
5. The licence holder must immediately recover, or remove and dispose of, spills of environmentally hazardous material, including chemicals, fuel, oil or other hydrocarbons, whether inside or outside an engineered containment system.
6. The licence holder must ensure that all material used for the recovery, removal, and/or disposal of environmentally hazardous materials is stored in an impermeable container prior to disposal at an appropriately authorised facility.

## Complaints, records and reporting

### Complaints and records

7. The licence holder must record the following information in relation to complaints received by the licence holder (whether received directly from a complainant or forwarded to them by the Department or another party) about any alleged emissions from the premises:
- the name and contact details of the complainant, (if provided);
  - the time and date of the complaint;
  - the complete details of the complaint and any other concerns or other issues raised; and
  - the complete details and dates of any action taken by the licence holder to investigate or respond to any complaint.
8. The licence holder must maintain accurate and auditable books including the following records, information, reports, and data required by this licence:
- the calculation of fees payable in respect of this licence;
  - production throughput (tonnes per annual period) to ensure compliance with condition 1.

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- (c) any maintenance of infrastructure that is performed in the course of complying with condition 2 and 3 of this licence;
  - (d) complaints received under condition 7 of this licence.
- 9.** The books specified under condition 8 must:
- (a) be legible;
  - (b) if amended, be amended in such a way that the original version(s) and any subsequent amendments remain legible and are capable of retrieval;
  - (c) be retained by the licence holder for the duration of the licence; and
  - (d) be available to be produced to an inspector or the CEO as required.

**Reporting**

- 10.** The licence holder must:
- (a) undertake an audit of their compliance with the conditions of this licence during the preceding annual period, and
  - (b) prepare and submit to the CEO an Annual Audit Compliance Report in the approved form by 31 October each year.
- 11.** The Licence Holder must submit to the CEO, no later than 31 October each year, a summary of complaints received under Condition 7 of this Licence for the preceding annual period.
- 12.** The Licence Holder must comply with a Department Request, within 14 days from the date of the Department Request or such other period as agreed to by the Inspector or the CEO.

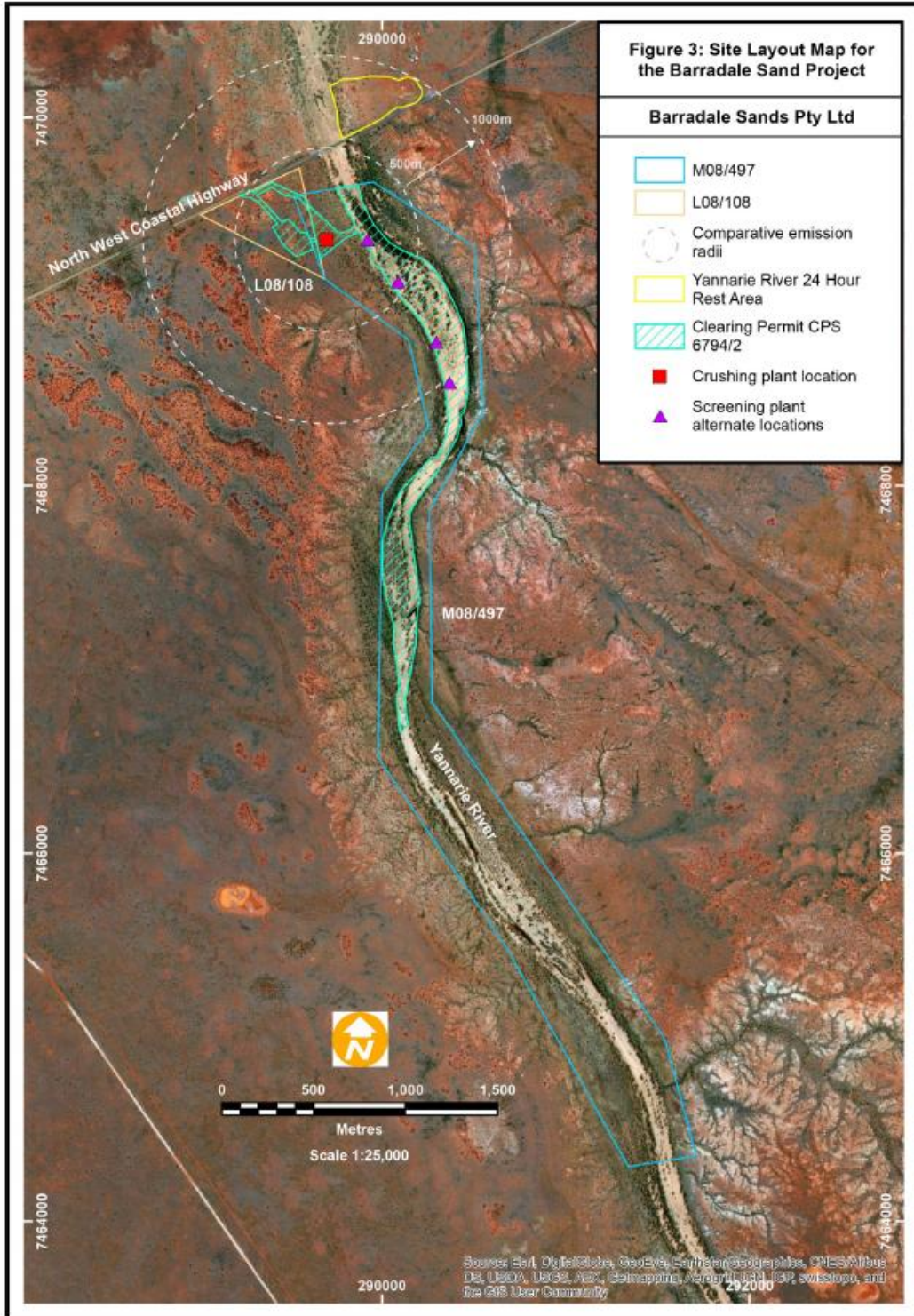


Figure 1: prescribed premises boundary and screening plant locations

In the map below (Figure 1), the premises boundary is defined by the blue and orange lines of M08/497 and L08/108 respectively.
